Historic merger of local charity with Gorta

Two of Ireland's longest established overseas development charities - Self Help Africa and Gorta - have completed an historic merger. The merger creates one of Europe's largest agricultural development charities working in Africa. Self Help Africa has a local base in Westside Resource Centre.

Announcing details of the merger, CEO Ray Jordan said that by working together, Gorta and Self Help Africa would save costs on administration, and help more people in rural Africa in the years ahead.

"We do the same thing, in many of the same countries. When we sat down and started looking at this together it made complete sense that we should team up, ultimately for the benefit of the people in Africa that we serve," he said.

In the coming year the newly merged charity estimates that it will support more than three million people in 12 African countries. The focus of work will be on supporting farming communities to grow more and earn more from their land. Both charities have a long history of working in agricultural development in Africa, and have deep roots within farming in Ireland. Self Help Africa has been the long-standing charity of choice of the Irish Farmers Association, while Gorta was founded almost half a century ago arising from an initiative to combat global hunger that was spearheaded by the Department of Agriculture.

20 Years A-Growing

Westside Resource Centre Ltd celebrates 20 years in operation in 2014. Established in 1994, Westside Community Development Resource Centre - as it was known at the time - arose to help meet the needs of the people in the Westside area.

There was an obvious need for a centre where people could come for services, classes, group meetings and social gatherings. Isolation and disadvantage, in many different forms, were pressing issues in the Westside area and the establishment of a resource centre was seen as a positive step in combating these problems.

Westside Resource Centre was originally housed in one of the commercial buildings on the former premises of Lydon House bakery. On 6th June 2001 President Mary McAleese officially opened the present purpose-built Westside Resource Centre.

Apart from the nine local and national organisations that have longterm leases on offices in the building (see page 4 for more information) the resource centre hosts many community, not-for-profit and educational groups throughout the year.

Community groups such as Westside Men's Group, Westside Community Patchers, Westside Craft Group and Westside Community Garden use the resource centre on a weekly basis.

The existence of Westside Resource Centre has brought about improvements in the lives of many people in the area over the years. Access to important services in the heart of the community has been a very helpful addition. The skills and friendships that developed through the various classes and courses have also made an important contribution in reducing isolation and helping to empower people to make a positive contribution to their own community
