Thousands of people access the services based in the centre each year and it has become the main hub of community activity in the local area.

Galway Bike Festival will take place in tandem with National Bike Week over the period June 14 to June 22, 2014. Festival coordinators highlight the fact that last year more than 30 different cycling events took place, including numerous family friendly cycles, children's bike racing, mountain biking, bike orienteering, a bike-fest film night, accessible cycling, cycle to work events and heritage cycles.
