"Painting the Planet"

A new community art project entitled "Painting the Planet" is now under way in Westside Resource Centre. The project ties in with the resource centre's focus on the UN Sustainable Development Goals throughout the year. Participants in "Painting the Planet" will create artistic representations of what the Sustainable Development Goals mean to them, their communities and the planet as a whole.

The UN Sustainable Development Goals were formulated and ratified by over 150 countries in 2015 with the aim of making our world a more equal and safer place to live for everyone. The Goals address issues such as hunger, access to clean water, education,



gender equality and many more critical issues in today's world. The targets set out by the UN can only be met by concerted action on the part of governments, communities and individuals and the "Painting the Planet" art project is an excellent example of these principles in action at a local level.

Our Place – Our Story

As part of the consultation process for the National Planning Framework's Ireland 2040 - Our Plan, Westside Public Library has organised a number of community workshops in Westside Resource Centre. The theme of the national consultations is "Our Place - Our Story" and the community workshops are on the topic of "Westside now and in the future".

The workshops are free of charge and are being held at different times on three Thursdays (7th September 7:30-9:00pm) (14th September 3:00-4:30pm) (28th September 11:30am-1:00pm) in order to allow as many people as possible to attend. All are welcome and there will be light refreshments available during the workshops.

The culmination of the event will be a round-table discussion in Westside Public Library on Wednesday 4th October at 6pm.

Heritage Week 2017

A range of events took place in Westside during Heritage Week 2017. Westside Public Library hosted the launch of the Galway Butterfly Project and also held the "Westside Story" exhibition. Photographs from the Lawrence Collection were also on display; showing Galway in the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries.

Westside Resource Centre screened the documentary "Fís na Fuiseoige" (The Lark's View). The director Aodh Ó Coileáin was on hand to introduce the film and give some background to how it came to be made. "Fís na Fuiseoige" explores the sense of place and the connection between people and the environment in which they live.



From Dublin Bay to Galway Bay... and back again!

Westside Resource Centre would like to extend warmest congratulations to Ronan Scully on his successful completion of the "Bay to Bay" Challenge. Ronan, who works for Gorta - Self Help

Africa, walked across Ireland from Dublin Bay to Galway Bay before Easter; a distance of 250km.

€30.000 was raised by Ronan for Gorta - Self Help Africa's work with some of the poorest people in the world. A portion of the money raised will also go to Galway Rape Crisis Centre and a Midlands charity.

Inspired by Ronan's feat, Westside Resource Centre held a "Bay to Bay" cycle during Bike Week in June. We installed two spinbikes (kindly loaned to us by Aidan Reade from Black Rose Racing) and set ourselves and all comers the challenge of covering the 250km between Galway Bay and Dublin Bay in the space of one day. We ended up reaching 300km and raised much-needed funds on the day for Gorta - Self Help Africa.
